Summary:

Old maps and city maps are often used to research the history of cities. Compared to Western cities, Japanese cities have often undergone significant changes in appearance since the modern era, but major streets and religious facilities such as temples and shrines have often retained their original appearance. The aim of this theme is to discuss the history of cities by taking up urban landscape maps from the East and West and actually looking at Uesugi's Rakuchu Rakugai-zu Byobu (one of the representative examples, owned by the Uesugi Museum, Yonezawa), and learning about the landscape expressions of cities and architecture.
