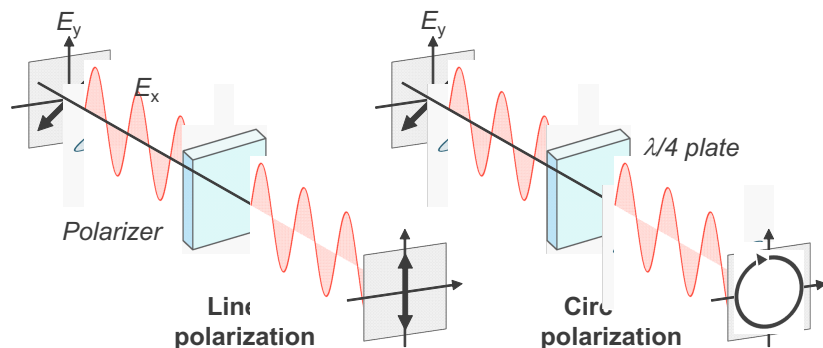

Abstract:

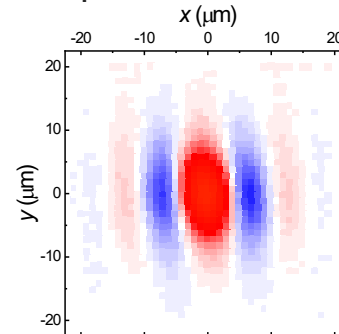
